About Citrix Files for Mac

Citrix Files for Mac allows you to access your files directly through a mapped drive, providing a native Finder experience. Files are downloaded only when accessed, and temporarily stored on your computer. Changes made to the files are automatically saved back to the cloud. You can access more functionality through the right-click context menu and perform operations such as sharing or requesting of files.

Delete files

The following steps explain how to delete files in Citrix Files for Mac.

1. Select the file you want to delete.
2. Drag the file to Mac trash.

The file is deleted.

Download Citrix Files for Mac


The following steps explain how to download Citrix Files for your Mac.

1. Download the installer DMG from here [Citrix Files for Mac](#).
2. Open the installer package and follow the prompts to install Citrix Files. You might be required to provide an administrator password to complete the installation.

Open Citrix Files for Mac


1. Select the Citrix Files icon to open Citrix Files for Mac.

2. Type your account URL (enter “mycompany” for mycompany.sharefile.com).

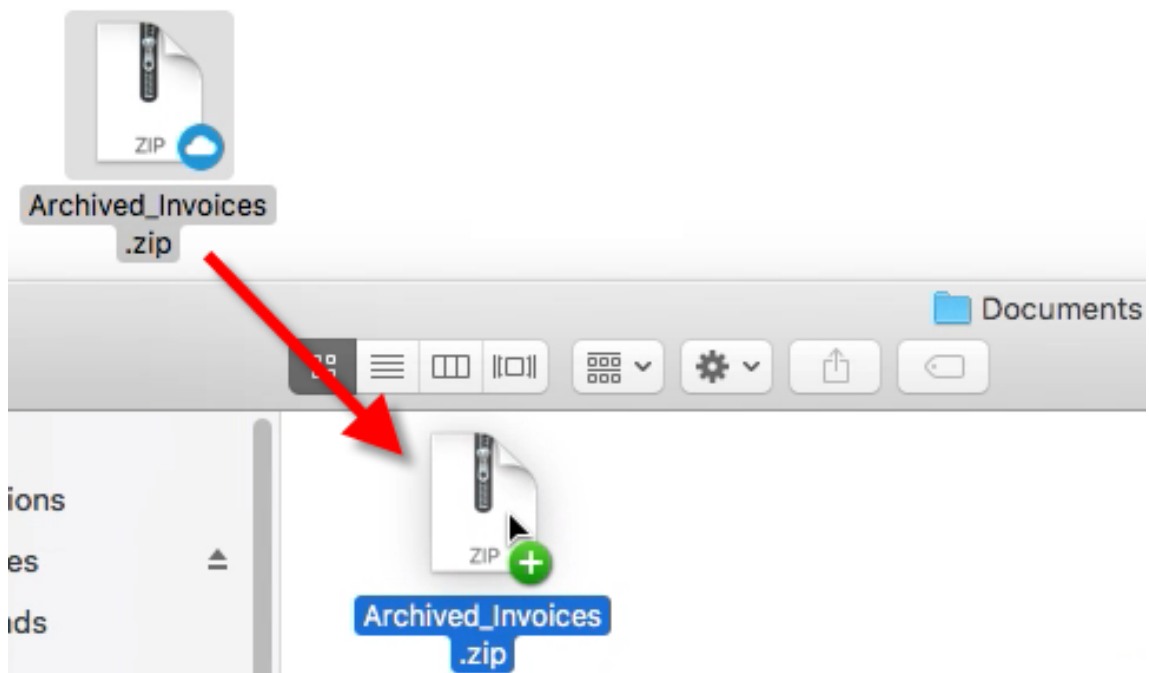

2. Open the Citrix File folder in **Finder**.
3. Drag the file and drop on your desktop.



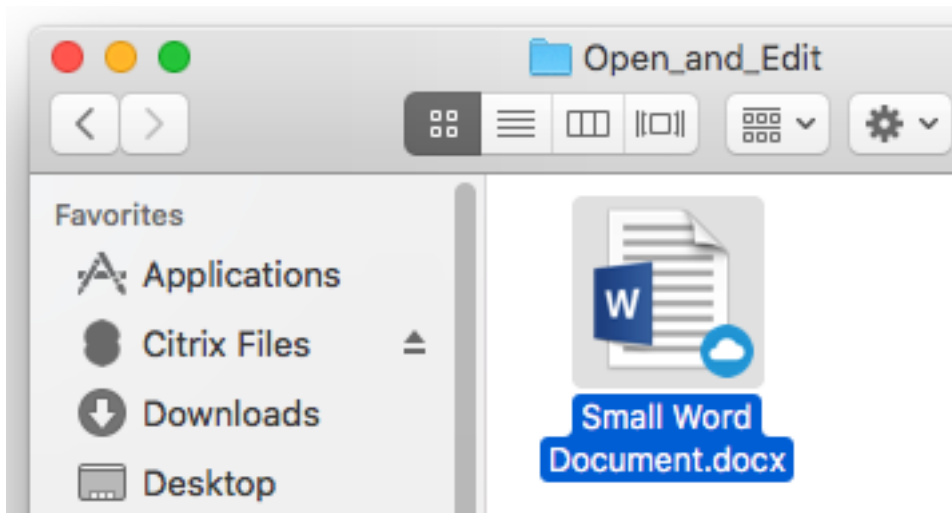
4. Double-click to open and view the file.

The following steps explain how to open files using Citrix Files for Mac.

1. Open the Citrix Files folder in Finder.
2. Select the file you want to open.



3. Double-click to open the file.

Share files

Use Control-click to access the **Share** menu.

1. In the menu, select one of the following options to share the file:
 - **Copy Link:** Copies the link to the clipboard for pasting in a message.
 - **Email with Citrix Files:** Opens **Email with Citrix Files** window. You enter the recipients, subject, and a message before sharing the file.
 - **Email with Mail App:** Opens your primary mail app with the share link embedded in the message. You add the recipients email address, provide a subject, and a message.
 - **Initiate Approval:** Opens the **Initiate Workflow** window.

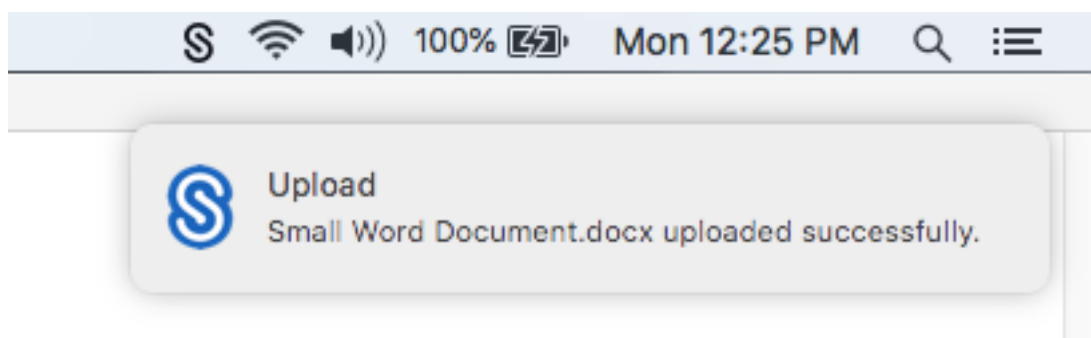
Upload files

The following steps explain how to upload files using Citrix Files for Mac.

1. Select the file you want to upload.
2. Open the Citrix Files folder in Finder.

3. Drag the file to the Citrix File folder in Finder. The upload success message displays.
